“**Archeology of Memory**” follows
 exiled musician Quique Cruz from the San
 Francisco Bay Area to Chile and back, as he
 creates a multimedia installation and musical
 suite to heal the wounds inflicted by state-
 sponsored torture of the Pinochet regime.
 Director and producer, Quique Cruz presently
 leads the Latin American fusion jazz group
 Quijeremá (www.quijerema.com). Co-director
 Marilyn Mulford was the producer/director of
 Freedom on Mind, an award winning feature
 length documentary on the Mississippi Voter
 Registration Project, 1961-1964.

Berkeley’s La Peña Cultural Center
 was started by a multi-racial group of Latin
 Americans and North Americans as a response
 to the military coup that overthrew the socialist
 government of Salvador Allende. La Peña
 incorporated on September 11, 1974 a year
 after the coup, and opened its doors in June of

The **Berkeley Public Library** is joining libraries across the state in participating in "Snapshot: One Day in the Life of California Libraries" on **October 5, 2010**, to show how important academic, public, school, and special libraries and library systems are to the state of California. This Snapshot Day has been developed by the California Library Association (CLA).

On October 5, 2010, **Berkeley Public Library** will compile statistics, users' comments, photographs, and other data chronicling a typical library day. The results collected at **Berkeley Public Library** will be added to those of other libraries across California, by CLA, to show how libraries provide invaluable services to California citizens. **Berkeley Public Library** is also planning several programs that day for patrons of all ages: please come and participate!

Kim Bui-Burton, CLA President and Director of the Monterey Public Library: "I invite all California community members of any age to visit their library on this historic day and be a part of this first ever "snapshot" of California libraries.
